Protection from Abuse (PFA) Information

PURPOSE:

- 1. To protect the victim
- 2. To tell the abuser how to behave towards the victim

Reminder: Let the victim decide whether a PFA is a safe option. We are here to provide support and options, not tell her what to do.

- Check into room 3030, on the 3rd floor of the Family Court facility, 440 Ross Street (in the old County Jail building, across the street from the City County Building where Family Court was formerly located), in Downtown Pittsburgh.
- Information on where to park is located on the back of this page, at the bottom
- An advocate will be in room 3030 to help the victim fill out the PFA form.
- After hours, weekends, and holidays, see **EMERGENCY** (**TEMPORARY**) **PFA** on page 8.
- Child care provided

What to expect:

- A Family Division Judge will conduct a short hearing at 1:00 p.m. The victim should plan to be at Court until approximately 2:00 p.m. on the day the application is filed.
- If needed, a children's playroom is available, free of charge, at the Family Division.
- The telephone number is 412-350-4086.
- This is a two-hearing process. Initially, if granted, the victim will receive a <u>Temporary PFA</u> that will expire after 7 to 10 days (the length of the PFA is determined by the judge). At this time a date for the <u>Final PFA</u> hearing will be set.
- Immediately after the <u>Temporary PFA</u> hearing, the victim should apply for a free attorney at Family Court thru Neighborhood Legal Services.

What next:

- Three copies of the Temporary PFA will be issued.
 - The first should immediately be distributed to the police department where the abuser lives, so the police can serve the PFA.
 - The second copy should be distributed to the police department where the victim lives.
 - The third copy is the victim's and should be kept on her person at all times.
 - It is also recommended that copies be distributed to the police department(s) where the victim works and/or frequently visits, if different from where she lives.
- The police will then serve a copy of the PFA Order to the individual being charged with abuse, and his/her presence will be requested at the Final PFA hearing. If the police can not locate the abuser, any competent

adult can serve the PFA on the abuser. The victim can photocopy her copy of the **petition and temporary order** to be served on the abuser.

• A week to 10 business days later, the second hearing will take place to determine if the <u>Final PFA</u> will be granted. This PFA term may last up to three years depending on the judge and severity of the abuse. **It is not recommended to go to a Final PFA hearing without an attorney**. Call Women Center & Shelter's Legal Advocacy Department at 412-355-7400 to get information on representation. This is based on income.

What to do if the PFA is violated:

- Call the police. The police are mandated to arrest the abuser.
- If the police do not make an arrest, the victim can file an <u>Indirect Criminal Complaint</u> with her local district justice. If the local district justice is not available, refer the victim to Night Court.
- The victim can also write an account of what happened and the police's failure to respond, and give it to our legal advocacy department. They will submit it to the Chief of Police in the area where the violation occurred.

EMERGENCY (TEMPORARY) PFA

WHERE TO GO WHEN FAMILY COURT IS CLOSED:

Monday through Friday - 11am until 4:30pm:

- The victim can file at the office of her/his local district justice.
- Call the district justice first.

- Night Court is located on the first floor of the Municipal Court Building, which is Downtown next to the new jail.
- Phone calls are accepted after 6pm.
- The office is open 24 hours on weekends and holidays.

What to expect:

- Initially, if granted, the victim will be issued an <u>Emergency PFA</u>. This PFA will expire at the end of the next business day that Family Court is in session.
- For continued protection, the applicant should file a <u>Temporary PFA</u> the next business day in Room 3030 on the 3rd floor of the new Family Court facility. See **PROTECTION FROM ABUSE (PFA)** on page 6.

What next:

- Three copies of the PFA will be issued.
 - The first should immediately be distributed to the police department where the abuser lives, so the police can serve the PFA.
 - The second copy should be distributed to the police department where the victim lives.
 - The third copy is the victim's and should be kept on her person at all times.
 - It is also recommended that copies be distributed to the police department(s) where the victim works and/or frequently visits, if different from where she lives.
- The police will then serve a copy of the PFA Order to the individual being charged with abuse.

Emergency PFA reminders:

- The Emergency PFA <u>will expire</u> at the end of the next business day. The victim <u>must</u> go to Room 3030 of the new Family Court facility the next morning (unless it is on the weekend, then they must go on Monday morning) for continued protection.
- An Emergency PFA will not grant temporary custody of the children. To protect the children with an Emergency PFA, the children may be listed as plaintiffs.
- If the victim has a safe place to stay, or does not feel safe going out for an Emergency PFA, she may want to wait until the next business day to apply for the Temporary PFA, (since she will have to take this step anyway.) Let the victim decide what is safest.
